Considered the finest British female vocalist of her time, Dusty Springfield had many hits with plaintive, heart-rending songs such as "You Don't Have To Say You Love Me" and "Wishin' & Hopin'" as well as the upbeat "I Only Want To Be With You" as well as the saucy "Son of a Preacher Man," which reached new audiences after being featured in the 1994's popular movie Pulp Fiction.
